Class Parents

The Class Parent provides a critical link between the parents and the classroom teacher, the PTA and the school administration. There can be one or co-class parents per class or some parents have opted to break the tasks down so the effort is distributed.

Class parents (1 lead parent and deputy class parents):

Build a sense of community within the classroom

Foster a relationship with other class parents in the same grade

Keep families informed and organized

The Class Parent ensures that every parents of his/her class know what is happening in the classroom and in school. The Class Parent brings questions or feedback from parents to the classroom teacher, parent coordinator or other school officials.

Serve as the bridge to the larger school community

By assisting the teacher with a number of tasks and serve as a communication liaison between families, teacher(s), and the PTA. The Class Parents is expected to attend PTA meetings to keep abreast with current PTA matters and initiatives.

Other examples of how class parent can help their teacher(s) and families:

- Create a class google or yahoo group for class-related communication
- Coordinate volunteers in the classroom
- Help teachers schedule parent-teacher conferences
- Organize class snacks (depending on grade)
- Organize field trips and volunteers
- Organize teacher gifts
- Assist with First Fridays (theme related, occurring on the first friday of every month)
- Organize a class social/playdate/potluck
- Help with teacher wish lists/donor choose projects
- Create a grade-wide yearbook for PreK, K and 5th

Parent Teacher Association (PTA) Elected Positions

PS 133 needs devoted parents who are team players, organized and driven to be the voice of the parent community. They play an invaluable role creating community, raising much-needed funds and enriching the lives of our students.

All New York State public schools are mandated to have a School Leadership Team (SLT). it is the primary school-based vehicle for parents to work with teachers and the Principal to establish school priorities, ensure that the budget is aligned with those priorities, and evaluate our school's progress.

The group meets once a month, and the meeting is open to everyone.

Spring Auction & Social Event

The Spring Auction is our biggest fundraiser of the year and also a lot of fun! This is great opportunity to spend a night out (kid-free!), enjoy delicious food and tasty drinks, and bid on amazing items. Event has been in April.

Volunteers needed before the event

Solicitation (should start as early as September)

- Contact businesses and individual to collect donations that will be auction at the event.
- Create and maintain a database on donations, donor, item value, description, etc. and keep track of all donated items and gift certificates.
- · Contact businesses and individuals to get sponsorships.

Communication and Design

- Write information about the event (save the date, call for donations, etc.) for web site, email, social media, etc.
- · Help create the visual theme for the event, from poster to catalog.

Catalog

Collect information about donations and write fun descriptions of the items.

Ticket sales

We start selling tickets mid-January (online and once or twice a week in the lobby). Tickets are not actually printed; names are put on a guest list.

Party Planning

- · Choose the theme event and décor
- Look into catering options, decide on menu and more!

Volunteers needed the day of the event

Set-up and decoration

- · Decorations: Set up tables and display auction items
- Check in: Welcome guests, catalogs, assign bid number, drink tickets, process payments.
- Check out: Gather bidding sheets, prepare invoices, process payments, distribute items to winning bidders.
