

October PTA General Meeting Minutes

Date, Time, and Location: Wednesday, October 18, 2016, 8:30 a.m., Auditorium

CALL TO ORDER: The meeting was called to order by the President at 8:36am.

REPORTS

PRESIDENT'S REPORT: presented by Julie Couser

There has been a great amount of support we have already gotten this year. Has been a great group effort. Fall Festival was a huge success. Thank you!

Annual Appeal:

We need everyone to donate at any amount.

Can give check, credit card and recurring donation. Also company matches are a huge asset. Very important that we all chip in so the PTA can pay for all the programs.

Election Day bake sale. Will be a lot of people coming through the school. We can make a huge amount of money. Need a lot of volunteers that day- shifts and baking.

World Culture Day coming up. November 18th, LCD committee is leading that program.

Still need a communications secretary position to be filled. Please contact PTA if you are interested.

Teacher Grants have gone out. Parents are not to get involved in the process. It is for the teachers to determine what will enhance their class academically. Example of ideas: printers, seat sacks, professional advancement classes.

Lunch and Recess: A few parents have expressed concern about lunch and recess. Not enough time to play or eat. Why are K and 2nd grade playing together? Enough supervision?

Title I presented by Tim Wilkins

Title I is a federally funded program. Money helps school with programing. 1% of the money goes to parent involvement. Criteria to qualify for title I is in limbo now- not dependent on free lunch eligibility. Government will look at how the school supports low income students and ELL students.

We have been able to fund the software program Reading A-Z. Reading A-Z online learning tools; leveled reading in English, French and Spanish for online reading or printing. Gives access to every kid to leveled books. The license is expanded to all classes this year.

Does anyone want to be part of the title I committee to support the title I status in the school? We can vote for 2 parents to be part of the committee. There are meetings once a month and then report back to the school community on what has been happening.

Two parents are interested in taking the free position. They will talk to Tim after the meeting.

TREASURER'S REPORT: presented by Jerome Tagger

Our goal is to not lose money. Because we manage playlab we are looking for them to make a profit.

Fundraising is hugely important to the success of the PTA and the programs it funds.

Our overall revenue target is \$611K

Our overall expenses are \$588K Playlab net contribution \$33K Budget revenue \$23K
